# How to create YOUR OWN EVENT

#### How do I start?

The first step is to decide the type of fundraising event you want to hold, and what you're capable of organising. Remember the best events are the ones that you'll enjoy, so choose something that you'll have fun with.

#### Get some help from family & friends

It will be easier and more enjoyable to organise an event with other people, so speak to your friends and family about your ideas and seek their help and advice. You'll need to find people who are reliable as well as creative, hardworking and enthusiastic.

#### Make a plan

Start with a list of things that need to be done and a timetable for doing them. This will help you work out the number of people you'll need to help you put the event together. Once you have that, then set a date and spread the word!

#### Hold a meeting

Get everybody together to talk about the event. Usually you'll find that people will volunteer to carry out certain duties, but you may need to assign some tasks to people in the group. At the end of the meeting be sure that everyone has a written record of what they need to do and by when.

#### Why not get your local community on board?

Invite local businesses to make a donation or donate in kind by offering their venue for the event or goods/services as prizes. Maybe you could get your work involved as well by holding an event and asking management to match the funds you raise. See the Workplace Giving section on our website:

#### Promote

Get the word out! Promote your event with posters or flyers (we can send you these) and ask local shops to display them for you. Contact your local newspaper and/or radio station and ask them for help. You could approach a local printing company and ask them to print some leaflets about your event for free. Why not send out invitations to your circle of friends and ask your circle to ask their circles!

#### **Event venue**

If it's a small event with a few friends and family, then try to use your own home or a friend's home. But if you want something bigger such as a dance or disco, you could hire a church hall, scout hut or community centre room. Speak with people in the local community and find out if somebody has links with the local community centre as they may be able to book the hall for a discount.

#### How to make money for the animals!

Set a fundraising target. This will inspire you and your supporters to work to achieve it! How you raise money is up to you. The simplest ways are to ask for a minimum donation for entrance or participation, or to set up an Animals Asia donation box and let your guests donate as much as they like.

We suggest your ask you guests to donate, rather than pay a fee or charge, because Gift Aid can be claimed on donations. If guests can't attend the event, you can invite them to donate using a donation form. Donation forms or sponsorship forms are available on request.

#### Set up a fundraising page

A great way to raise sponsorship is via the website Virgin Money Giving: http://uk.virginmoneygiving.com/

You will get your own fundraising page which enables you to a send a web link to all of your friends, family and work colleagues and they can use it to make a donation online. You'll get a page that enables you to a send a web link to your friends, family and work colleagues and they can use it to make a donation online.

This is often much simpler than having to run around with a sponsorship form and collect all the money after the event and saves Animals Asia a vast amount in administration time. Virgin Money Giving collects the donations and pays them directly into our bank account. They also claim the Gift Aid for us.

#### Gift Aid

If you're in the UK remember you can increase donations by 25% through Gift Aid. Make sure your guests know it's a fundraiser before they come along so they're prepared to donate.

If your guests would like to make their donations go further please pass on their contact details to us so we can send them a Gift Aid Declaration. Or ask them to complete one of our forms <u>here</u>.

## Some important guidelines for representing Animals Asia

- Don't use sponsorship money as donations to fund your event (eg buying food, alcohol, etc)
- Try to be cruelty free. If your event involves food, please consider giving meat a miss.
- Keep prizes cruelty free too avoid leather and fur, and cosmetics that have been tested on animals. We have an ethical policy that you can request from your local office.
- Please avoid using venues used for animal sports.
